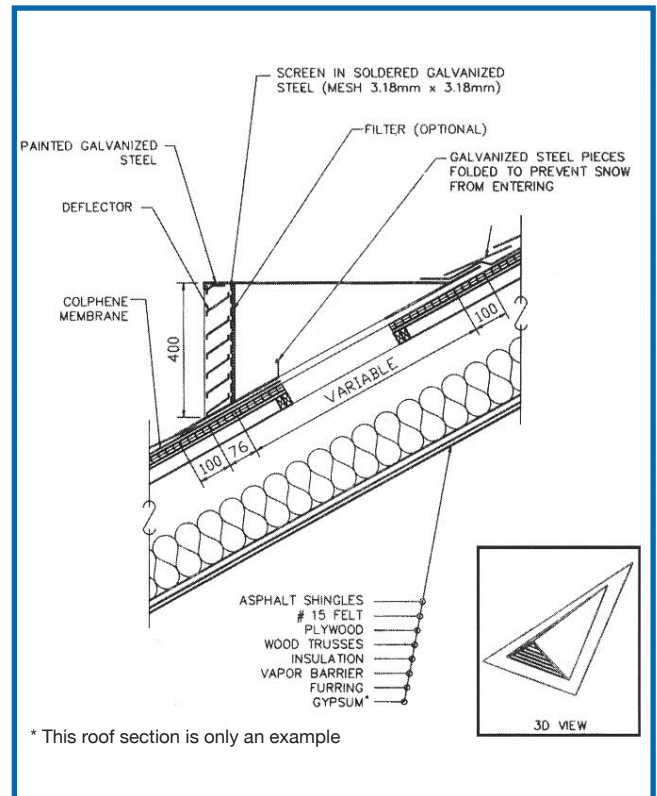
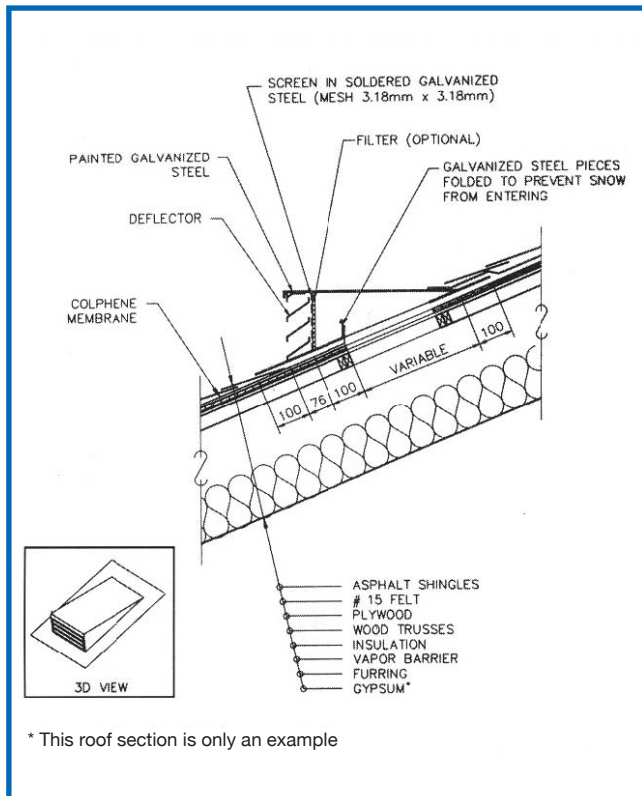
## Special roof ventilators or air openings

# ROOF VENTILATORS FOR AIR INTAKE

## DESCRIPTION

This unit was design to solve problems like;

- Blown insulation blocking the airflow into the attic.
- Wall of the building touches the underside of the roof deck preventing airflow.
- Blocker boards between the rafters blocking airflow.
- At the junction of the mansard and the eave of the top roof there is no airflow to the attic.
- Knee walls that have no attic air circulation.
- It can also be used for passive ventilation.

A vent which will prevent water or snow infiltrations while at the same time giving a continuous air flow into the attic.

Two dimensions available: (12" X 24") or (18" X 36")
